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Curious Children and their many, many Questions

Children are naturally very curious about all sorts of things. And their questions can come at busy times or can simply be overwhelming. Not to mention we often don't have all of the answers! Here are some tips about how to deal with your curious child and her/his many, many questions.

It can be tempting to ignore or reject your child's questions when they become overwhelming. Try to resist using answers like "Because I said so" or responding with "Stop bothering me." Answers like this can make your child feel sad for having expressed their curiosity and can set back their attempts to learn and explore. When you are too busy to handle your child's questioning, try to politely explain your feelings and assure them that you can answer these questions another time. But be sure that you make time later to do so!

Short answers are sufficient and will be your go-to response most of the time, but when you can find the time, questions are a great opportunity to expand your child's learning. Suggest ways that your child might be able to find or discover an answer to their question on their own, whether it be looking it up online or creating an experiment in your home. Ask your child what he/she thinks is the answer to a question and help them understand the virtues and flaws of their thinking.

And don't forget: It's okay to say 'I don't know.' In fact, when it's true, say it! Children need to understand that it is okay not to know. It also gives you an opportunity to learn the answer together!
