

Important Info!

We are currently in the Autumn/Fall Season but getting closer to Winter and the cold weather is creeping in quickly! Please dress your child accordingly and please be sure to update your child's cubby bin.

Keep In mind that Students go outside daily as long as it's between 32 and 92 degrees.

If possible, please label your children's belongings.

At Toddler Town Daycare, outside/home food and outside/home toys are not allowed or permitted at our center. Please keep home toys at home or in your vehicle, and, if you want your child to eat food outside our center, please have your child finish it in the car, but do not take it further in the school, or it will be tossed out. Also, cups allowed in the center are only cups that have water or that are empty, if you bring a cup or bottle containing anything else, we will send it back home. Please refer to your Toddler Town Parent policy handbook regarding these rules.

PROCARE ENGAGEMENT PROVIDES ALL THE SOURCES TO BE UP TO DATE WITH EVERYTHING GOING ON IN OUR CENTER. This includes Paying through the app, receiving documents, receiving important updates, communicating with teachers, and so much more. Ask us about ProCare Engagement!

SPECIAL REMINDER ABOUT PARKING RULES! Please be sure there is no double parking, parking opposite direction, blocking alleys and or driveways and no standing in the loading zone longer than 15 minutes.

Also, be sure you have your hazards on.

Toddler Town Daycare closes promptly at 6PM. Any time after that, families get charged \$15 every 10 minutes.

Tuition

Please Don't forget that payments must be made on the 1st & 15th of every month. On the first you either pay full tuition, or half of the tuition. If you pay only half on the 1st, you have until the 15th to pay the other half. Late fees will be applied for no payments after the first and to unpaid balances after the 15th.



*How To Prepare Ahead of Cold and Flu Season

1. STOCK UP ON HYGIENE PRODUCTS

Make sure you have enough tissues, wipes, hand sanitizer, aquaphor and hand cream. The tissues, wipes, and hand sanitizer are for wiping and disinfecting, and the aquaphor and hand cream are for moisturizing after. A lot of companies also now make child friendly hand sanitizers so definitely stock up on those.

2. INCREASE THE VITAMIN INTAKE

Up the natural juice in take! This is a crucial one, something I stress to my teachers as well. As previously discussed, your immune system will kind of be all over the place during these few months so its a great idea to stock up on some great vitamins, and for kids perhaps a baby vitamin or natural juice. But not the sugary ones that make them bounce off the walls please! That is of no help to anyone, and has no beneficial vitamins either.





3. TEACH THE ELBOW SNEEZE!

This literally means teach them to cough/sneeze into their elbow. This is something we do every year and is a really big help once the preschoolers master it. Even though they only do it about 50% of the time, that is still 50% less of them sneezing on another student, work material, or teacher: /.

4. THE HAND WASH CYCLE

Wash their hands repeatedly. No seriously, as often as possible. I know this can sound really redundant and obvious, but honestly the more you make it a habit, the more your preschooler will too. Lead by example, help them, make it a cool big kid responsibility. And if you think you're doing it enough, just do it a little bit more. Trust me, you'll be happy you did.
