We have also been encouraging lots of independence and responsibility and have been teaching them a lot on safety, examples: AN ADULT and the number to dial in case of an emergency, 9-1-1. The project that has made the biggest impact is our

pinto bean. We planted a pinto bean in a cup on a cotton ball, and the children have been taking care of these beans for two whole weeks. Every day they remind me to take them outside, to water them and to say: WE ARE FINALLY GETTING RESULTS. For the month of July, I will continue to focus on safety and healthy habits and our Plants especially. Along with that, we will be talking about Bubbles, children will be experimenting with different ways of forming or creating bubbles and will also be exploring with water and be introduced to soil.
