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Communicating Effectively with Your Childcare Provider

Your child's teacher may spend more waking hours with your child during the week than you do. For some parents this can be a frustrating reality, for others a welcome relief. Whatever your feelings on the

matter, this person plays an important role in your child's life and it is important to have a good relationship with her and for the two of you to share information about your child so that you can both attend to your child's individual needs.

There are many ways that your child's teacher try to communicate with you about your child's development. Here at Toddler Town we share pictures, videos, and descriptions through the Teaching Strategies website; we put videos up in the entryway, we regularly update the bulletin boards with projects and pictures from your child's classroom; not to mention our monthly NEWSLETTER! Connect on Trachers

Parents and Teachers need to work together.

Beginning and end of the day conversations can be important too. Some teachers are more communicative than others (and some parents easier to talk to), but it is important to develop a relationship with your child's teacher so that these conversations become easy and natural. Remember not only to ask questions, but also to tell your child's teacher about what is going on at home and things that you may have noticed about your child.

Remember that when talking to the teacher about concerns that you may have about what goes on in the classroom to focus on emotions first and solutions second. Understand how you and the teacher may feel about the matter at hand and then discuss solutions. And don't forget to show appreciation from time to time for what your child's teacher does! Parents: Even though the


