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Happy September to our families!!! This month is going to be a busy month as we will be starting our upcoming school year. Transitions will have finally become permanent September 8th, meaning students that have been transitioning will now be in their new classes with their new teachers. Therefore, be sure to meet with your child's new teacher(s) to get familiar with how things are run in the new classroom. Also parents, now is the time to make sure that your child has everything they need for their new class. This means a blanket, pillow, and a change of clothes. It is important that your child is prepared for their new class and that they are as comfortable as they can be. Also the weather is getting chillier, so be sure you bring your child a jacket/sweater, just in case they need it.

REMINDERS:

- September 4th: Field trip! Buses will leave at 9:15 a.m. Sharp!
- September 7th: NO SCHOOL!!! Closed for Labor Day!
- Notify the school if your child is ill with a contagious illness.
- Update your contact numbers.
- Wash your child's hands upon arrival.

Furthermore, mark your calendars for September 4th as we will going on a field trip. We ask that you be on time as the buses will depart at 9:15 a.m. sharp, no exceptions! If your child will not be attending, be sure to find alternate means of child care. Also, we will be closed Monday, September 7th for Labor Day so please be sure to find alternate child care as well. Classes will resume Tuesday, September 8th.

Furthermore, we want to remind parents that we have an Open Door Policy. You are welcome to visit your child's class whenever you'd like. You are welcome to sit in, observe, read a book, interact with their class, etc. This is also a great opportunity for you to become familiar with what a typical day looks like for you child. It is also great for your child to see their parent(s) involved in their school. Children love seeing new faces, so why not pop in one day and surprise your child and their class! They always love to keep busy, so come prepared with a storybook, game, or anything clever you think they would enjoy!

Lastly, parents we urge you to continue to contact your state legislatures to resolve the issues pertaining to AFC. Be sure to check your emails periodically as we will send you any updates that come our way about the changes with AFC. For now, July 1st standards are still in effect, but that the good news is that the payments are no longer being frozen. However, these changes still affect us and any new parents trying to enroll, so again we insist that you continue to reach out to your state legislature to fix the matter.
